



Important changes for Medicare Part D patients in 2025

An annual cap on OOP costs may lower costs for seniors. Patients will also have the option to participate in a payment plan that spreads costs out over the plan year.^{1,2}

Spending cap on Part D prescriptions

Recent changes in law have added a **cap on how much Medicare patients need to pay** for their Part D medicines. This means you would pay a **maximum of \$2000** for your Part D medicines in 2025.¹

Medicare Part D Prescriptions Payment Plan

In 2025, all Medicare Prescription Plans* must offer enrollees the option to pay their prescription drug costs through a **monthly payment plan** instead of all at once at the pharmacy.^{1,2}

You can enroll in this monthly payment plan option as early as **October 15, 2024**, or **at any point during your coverage.**^{2†}

► **Please contact your Part D plan to enroll in this option**

In 2025, XTANDI patients with Part D coverage may reach their maximum pharmacy cost of \$2000 on the first prescription for XTANDI and have no further pharmacy costs for the rest of the year.^{1,3,4}

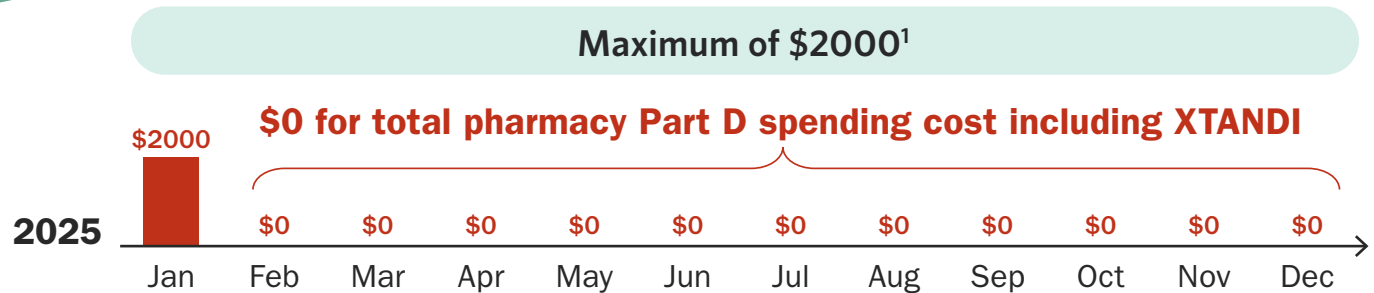

Example patient scenarios

Derek was prescribed XTANDI in January 2025. Depending on his plan design and the benefit phase that he is in, his Part D pharmacy cost can reach a maximum of \$2000 in January, and then \$0 for the rest of the year.¹



PACE, Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly.

*This provision does not apply to the Limited Income Newly Eligible Transition (LI NET) coverage because participants in the LI NET program do not enroll in a prescription drug plan or Medicare Part D plan to receive transitional coverage under the program.²

†Under section 1894(a) of the Act, PACE organizations must provide all medically necessary services including prescription drugs, without application of deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, or other cost-sharing that would otherwise apply under Medicare or Medicaid.² While the Medicare Prescription Payment Plan is applicable to all Part D plans, it has no practical application for PACE organizations. In addition, the program has no application to those demonstration Medicare-Medicaid Plans that have no Part D cost-sharing.

Derek could also reach out to his Medicare Part D plan to enroll in the Medicare payment plan and spread his \$2000 maximum Part D pharmacy cost across monthly installments*† throughout the year.^{1,2}

Some Medicare Part D patients may qualify for Extra Help



Extra Help (also known as the low-income subsidy, or LIS) is a Medicare Part D program that helps people with limited financial means pay for their prescription medicines.^{6,7}

With Extra Help, Medicare Part D patients may pay even less for prescription medicines in 2025^{1,5,7}

- If you receive Extra Help, Medicare will pay most of the costs of your prescription medicine^{6,7}
- Before you meet the maximum Part D pharmacy cost cap, your generic medicines will cost \$4.90, and your brand-name medicines will cost \$12.15 each time you get them filled⁵
- Once you reach the cap, you'll pay \$0 each time you fill any medicines for the rest of the year⁴⁻⁶

In 2025, everyone with Medicare Part D who qualifies for Extra Help may pay ≤ \$12.15 for XTANDI⁵

Some Medicare Part D patients may qualify for Extra Help (cont'd)

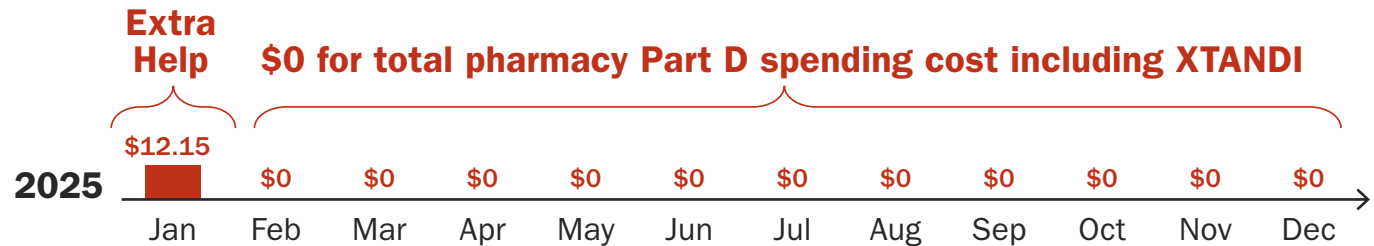

Example Extra Help patient scenario

Jacob is prescribed XTANDI in January 2025. He receives Extra Help, so he pays a copay the first month and then nothing for the rest of the year once he hits his maximum Part D pharmacy cost cap.*^{1,3-5,8}

Extra Help patients prescribed XTANDI may pay as little as \$12.15 in copays in 2025^{1,3,8}



*Extra Help covers the difference between \$12.15 and the maximum Part D pharmacy cost cap of \$2000.^{4-6,8}

Find out if you are eligible for Extra Help (also known as the LIS)



Extra Help is available for certain patients. Your income and your assets, like your savings or investments, are considered. If you meet the criteria, you may receive Extra Help.⁷

To be eligible for Extra Help in 2025, you must⁷:



Be enrolled in a Medicare plan



Live in the United States



Earn no more than the established income limit and not own a lot of high-priced assets
